The School of Business Administration will hold an Open House on Thursday, January 14 at 5:30 p.m. in AC 201 for those interested in learning more about the accredited Professional Master of Business Administration program offered by USC at Coastal.

The open house will include a brief presentation about the program, a tour of the recently completed MBA "electronic" classroom, and refreshments.

Courses in the MBA program are offered via closed circuit television with a live talk-back system to Columbia. Students attend classes two nights a week plus one Saturday per month in Columbia. Those who begin the program in September 1988 will finish in 2 1/2 years.

It is not necessary to have an undergraduate degree in business administration to be accepted in the program. Those who have a four-year degree in any major plus two years full-time work experience may also qualify.
