## Emergency Closing Information

When inclement weather or other emergency conditions arise, the college may cancel classes. In this event, employees are expected to report to work. The college will remain open unless the governor closes state offices, which means the college will be closed for both students and employees. If employees are unable to report to work when classes have been canceled, they should contact their immediate supervisors to make arrangements for taking annual leave or compensatory time. Employees are not expected to risk dangerous traveling conditions to report for work. Announcements will be made as follows:

**Classes Canceled** (Students do not report, employees do report unless they are experiencing problems, in which case they should contact their immediate supervisor.)

**College Closed** (The governor has closed all state offices and students and employees do not report.)

Compensation During Declaration of Emergency  
Employees who do not report to work or who report late to work shall use accrued annual or compensatory leave to make up time lost, take leave without pay, or be allowed to make up time lost from work at a time to be scheduled by the University. The employee must be given the option of making up the time lost from work if desired.
