Annual Afro-American History Month Program Planned

The Afro-American Student Association and Coastal will celebrate Black History Month beginning January 29 with a "Gospel Sing Out" at 7 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium.

The "Gospel Sing Out", moderated by Attorney Ralph Wilson from Conway, will feature music by the Cheerleaders of Cherry Hill Baptist Church in Conway and The Greater Inspirational Mass Choir of Horry County, directed by Mr. Tony Bellamy. Featured soloists will be Ms. Jean Blain Sketter and Mr. Wilson T. Blain.

There will be a reception following on the mezzanine of Wheelwright Auditorium.

On February 2, a Leadership Challenge Luncheon and Workshop will be held at 1 p.m. in SC-205 with Reuben M. Greenberg, Chief of Police of Charleston, as speaker. Greenberg also will be the keynote speaker for the 7 p.m. program in Wheelwright Auditorium which will include music by Hilda McKiever, media specialist at Aynor High School. The accompanist will be Leslie McIver, band director at Conway High School. This program also will be followed by a reception.

Atlanta Chamber Players to Perform

The Atlanta Chamber Players will perform in Wheelwright Auditorium Thursday, January 28, at 8 p.m.

Known as one of the nation's most active chamber ensembles and one of the South's outstanding cultural resources, the musicians perform both traditional and contemporary works including those regularly commissioned from American composers.

The program at Coastal will include works by Rossini, Messiaen, Ives, and Dvorak.

In more than 100 appearances a year, the Atlanta Chamber Players present subscription concerts, college and university residencies, and many free concerts such as Decatur's "Concerts on the Square" and the annual Atlanta Arts Festival in Piedmont Park. Recent performances by the ensemble include Boston's Charles River Concert Series, New York's Merkin Concert Hall, Charleston's Spoleto Festival, and the Alabama Shakespeare Festival. They record for Press Avant Records.

The program is sponsored by the Cultural Arts Series. Tickets are \$7 for the public and \$4 for students. They will be available at the door.
