Fulbright Travel Grant To The People's Republic Of China

The South Carolina Consortium for International Studies has applied for a Fulbright-Hays grant to fund a study trip to the People's Republic of China. The program "Modernization and Social Change in China: A Curriculum Enrichment Project," will be from July 8 to August 20, with a pre-departure orientation at Winthrop College from June 15 through 18.

Washington will announce the approved grants in early March, but faculty wishing to apply must submit all materials by March 15. If the project is funded, Coastal should get a place for one faculty member.

USC To Offer Spanish Courses In Mexico This Summer

The University of South Carolina is offering an intensive Spanish language program in Cuernavaca, Mexico from July 9 through August 9. Deadline for application is March 1.

To be eligible, students must have completed at least one year of college Spanish or the equivalent and must be admitted to USC for the summer session.

At the beginning of the program, each participant will be evaluated and placed in a language class appropriate to the individual's level of proficiency.

Classes will be taught by native Spanish speakers from a local language school five days a week for four hours daily.

Students completing the course will receive three hours of credit for SPAN 350 Spanish Language Study Abroad. An additional three hours of credit are available through SPAN 399 Independent Study, which requires completion of a project related to the stay in Mexico.

The program will include weekend excursions to places of interest in the region, along with the experience of living with Mexican host families in homes convenient to classes, shopping and recreation.

The estimated cost of the program is \$895 plus round-trip airfare between the United States and Mexico City. The cost includes registration and tuition at the Mexican language school, three hours of in-state USC tuition, room and three meals a day in the family home, round-trip transportation between Mexico City and Cuernavaca, and several excursions.
