## **Conway Hospital, Coastal Carolina College Establish Joint Center**

Heart attack victims in the Waccamaw-Grand Strand region will soon be able to receive valuable assistance in returning to normal life--thanks to a new healthcare center jointly established by Conway Hospital and Coastal Carolina College.

Plans for the new center, The R. Cathcart Smith Cardiac Rehabilitation Center were jointly announced by Conway Hospital President James S. Zoller and Chancellor Eaglin. The new center, named for Dr. R. Cathcart Smith, a prominent Horry County physician with longtime ties to the hospital and a founding member of the Coastal Educational Foundation, is designed to enable heart attack victims to return to normal life as quickly as possible through a supervised program of exercise, behavior modification and education.

Officials at Coastal see the new cardiac rehabilitation center as an important public service, according to Chancellor Ron Eaglin. "We at USC-Coastal Carolina College see the establishment of The R. Cathcart Smith Cardiac Rehabilitation Center as an appropriate extension of the college's total mission to the community," Eaglin said. "As an educational institution, our role is to provide meaningful education in a manner which assists the total person -- and that certainly includes healthcare. We have enjoyed a long and pleasant relationship with Conway Hospital, which we view as a local teaching hospital for our school of nursing, and we're gratified to engage in another joint program of service to our surrounding community."

Heart patients who participate in the rehabilitation center will undergo rehabilitative therapy in a three-phase program. In phase one, heart attack victims will receive preliminary rehabilitation treatment as patients in the hospital. Afterwards, in phases two and three, cardiac patients will undergo a controlled program of closely-monitored and graded exercise. Therapy will be administered by professional healthcare staff at Conway Hospital, which will provide all professional direction, all medical equipment and some exercise equipment. Coastal will provide a facility for the second and third phases of the program, some of the exercise equipment and access to the indoor swimming pool in the Physical Education Center. Education will be provided by hospital and college staff. Dr. Marshall Parker has been working with hospital officials in developing and implementing the program.

## National Strength And Conditioning Association Sponsors "Lift America"

The National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) will hold Lift America, a fund raising event for Special Olympics, at Coastal on Saturday, March 12, from 10:30 a.m. to noon in Kimbel Gymnasium.

As part of a national effort, Lift America is being coordinated locally by Ed Cerny who was recently named state director for NSCA. Both sponsors and participants are needed for the event.

The Lift America event will be the bench press, and it is open to men and women. Men will be benching 125 pounds, while the women will be benching 65 pounds.

There are two ways to make pledges for the Lift America event:

1. Pledge 10 cents a pound for the total number of pounds lifted.

2. Pledge \$1.00 a repetition.

For example, if a female bench presses the 65 pounds 10 repetitions for a total of 650 pounds, this would generate either a \$65 pledge or a \$10 pledge depending on whether pledge #1 or #2 was chosen.

No money is collected at the time of the event. The NSCA will bill the sponsor based upon the pledge cards collected. There are incentive awards for the participants as well.
