NCNB Traveling Art Exhibit Displayed At Wheelwright

The NCNB Traveling Art Exhibition will be displayed in Wheelwright Auditorium June 23 through 30 from 8:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. The exhibition is free and open to the public.
