Chancellor Announces 50% Tuition Waivers Available To Children Of Coastal Employees

The South Carolina legislature recently approved that tuition waivers would be permitted in South Carolina public institutions. Therefore, Chancellor Eaglin has announced that children of all full-time, permanent employees are eligible to receive a 50 percent tuition waiver upon their enrollment at USC Coastal. AASCU Publishes Book To Increase Minority Enrollment And Retention

A new book published by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities offers a variety of strategies to increase enrollment and retention of minorities at the nation's colleges and universities.

Minorities in Public Higher Education: At a Turning Point, addresses the fundamental issues confronting public higher education in its efforts to reach America's minorities. The book surveys higher education's historical progress in providing a path to equality and examines some disturbing recent trends that show a clear reversal of that progress.

Minorities in Public Higher Education includes essays by Clifford Wharton, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of TIAA/CREF and former chancellor of the State University of New York; John Maguire, president of Claremont University Center and Graduate School; and Albert N. Whiting, former chancellor of North Carolina Central University. Each author proposes strategies for renewing progress in the area of minority education, and special attention is given to historically black public colleges.
