AVX Donates Scanning Electron Microscope

AVX Corporation has presented to Coastal's School of Natural and Applied Sciences a scanning electron microscope equipped with a wave length and an energy dispersive spectrometer. The equipment is valued between \$70,000 and \$80,000.

The microscope will allow Coastal faculty and students to study small biological specimens as well as other microscopic particles such as grains of sand. It also will be possible to determine the mineral content of beach sediment with the equipment. The microscope will be used in both the Marine Science and Biology programs, and will allow Coastal to provide an expanded curriculum to students.

During a recent news conference announcing the donation, Dr. Kim Ritchie, vice president of R&D for AVX Corporation, said, "The main purpose of the gift is to show our support for the science curriculum at Coastal and to introduce the local community and student body to the technical expertise AVX has developed and implemented in Myrtle Beach. Myrtle Beach is the site of AVX's corporate R&D labs which direct and monitor the Company's worldwide R&D programs. It is our hope that students attending Coastal Carolina College who become familiar with scientific research techniques will be attracted to AVX for their future employment."

International Scientist Visits Coastal

Dr. Orson van de Plassche, a distinguished international scientist, from the Institute of Earth Science, Vrije Universiteit, The Netherlands, recently visited Coastal to

discuss with Dr. Paul T. Gayes, assistant professor of marine science and geology, the upcoming IGCP meetings in Amsterdam and Dr. Gayes' role in the program.

Dr. van de Plassche is program director of the International Geologic Correlation Programme entitled; "Quaternary coastal evolution; case studies, models and regional patterns." Respective research efforts with plans to collaborate on a joint publication on the post-glacial record of relative sea level change and associated coastal response in southern New England was also discussed during the visit. Plans were made concerning the possibility of initiating a research project to study sea level changes along the South Carolina coast. Students from both institutions would be involved.
