Coastal Holds Marine Science Program For Top Junior Scholars

Thirty-one of South Carolina's top ninth grade students are presently attending a two-week Junior Scholars program in marine science at Coastal. The program is offered to the top three percent of rising ninth grade students throughout the state. USC Coastal Carolina College Office of Public Relations, P.O. Box 1954, Conway, SC 29526

The program, which began July 17, allows students to learn about marine science and how understanding the marine processes in the area is critical to the utilization and preservation of the area environments. Students will study biological, geological, chemical, and physical science principles.

Activities include studying the coastal environment, as well as participating in scuba lessons, washovers, crabbing, sediment testing, and wave measurements. Tours are also scheduled throughout the session, and a briefing on beach erosion and management of Folly Beach will be given by Gered Lennon of the South Carolina Coastal Council, Monday, July 25, in Charleston.
