# **Ingle Named Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs**

Dr. Ronald R. Ingle, associate dean of the College of Applied Professional Sciences at the University of South Carolina, has been appointed vice chancellor for academic affairs at Coastal effective August 15.

Ingle was selected, following a national search, to replace Dr. James H. Rex who left Coastal to become senior vice president for development and alumni relations at USC Columbia.

Chancellor Eaglin said he was pleased to attract a person of Ingle's caliber. "He has extensive administrative and teaching experience," Eaglin said, "the kind of experience an academic leader in this institution will need as we continue to grow and evolve to meet the educational needs of this region."

Eaglin noted that that one of Ingle's most recent projects, a study of hotel and tourism training in the Bahamas, will be of particular interest to the college and the local business community. "Dr. Ingle's study team worked with government, education, and private industry in analyzing tourism manpower projections and training needs in the Bahamas, then made recommendations for planning and designing appropriate training programs to meet those needs. This type of experience will be helpful in the Waccamaw/Grand Strand region as the college begins to focus more on local social and economic issues through its four community outreach centers."

Ingle said he is looking forward to working with students, faculty, staff, and members of the community in setting an agenda for continued growth and development at Coastal. He said, "I am impressed by the quality of students and faculty at Coastal and by the close ties the institution has with the people of the region."

Ingle has been with the University of South Carolina since 1972 when he was named assistant dean of the College of General Studies. He was named associate dean of the College of Applied Professional Sciences in 1978 and during that time, from 1979 to 1981, he directed the USC Summer Enrichment Program for the Gifted and Talented. He also served three years as staff associate in the Office of Financial Aid at The Ohio State University in Columbus; three years as director of admissions at Kennesaw College in Marietta, Georgia; and two years as a counselor at South Georgia College in Douglas, Georgia.

He has taught university-level psychology courses at USC and South Georgia College.

A native of Moncks Corner, Ingle received his bachelor's degree in English from Wofford College, his master's degree in higher education administration from Florida State University, and his doctorate in psychology from The Ohio State University.

Ingle served as an officer in the U. S. Army at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, from 1964 to 1966.

Judy Ingle, his wife, is director of marketing for East Educational Services in Columbia. She has a bachelor of arts degree in English from Georgia State University, a master's in reading from USC, and is completing her doctoral studies in curriculum development at USC. They have two sons: David, a senior at the College of Charleston; and Stephen, a sophomore at Birmingham-Southern College in Birmingham, Alabama.

# **Distribution of Payroll Checks**

With Coastal's expanding payroll, it has become necessary to revise the system of payroll distribution recently. Please remember when you pick up your check from the Switchboard on payday or after that day in the Business Office, that you must present a picture identification (Coastal I.D. or driver's license). Employees are asked to sign their full name rather than just initial by their name on the check roster. If you are picking up another employee's paycheck, written permission must be presented at that time and you must sign your name by their name and show your identification. If you are picking up several checks for a department each payday, you may use the payroll authorization form which can be obtained from the Business Office. There has been some confusion over this and your help in implementing this new procedure is greatly appreciated.
