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## Faculty/Staff Development Workshop Planned

Coastal faculty and staff will take part in a University 101 faculty/staff development workshop August 14 to August 19 in the Peach Room at the Landmark Hotel in Myrtle Beach. A reception will follow the first session on Sunday, August 14, which will run from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. The remaining sessions will be from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily.

John Gardner, of the University of South Carolina in Columbia will be present for the first evening of the workshop. Gardner is vice chancellor for University Campus and Continuing Education, professor of library and information science, and director and developer of the University 101 program.

Gardner, who is at the forefront of a vibrant movement of higher education, has written two books for freshmen—"College is Only the Beginning," and "Step by Step to College Success," and has a third book due out soon. He also is involved with the National Center for the Study of the Freshmen Year Experience.

Gardner is noted for his various activities dealing with freshmen, and is best known to educators as the host of annual conferences on the freshmen year. During the last academic year, Gardner attracted more than 1,700 people to conferences in Columbia, South Carolina, Irvine, California, and Southampton, England.

Gardner was first asked to teach the University 101 course at the University of South Carolina, two years after its establishment in 1972. Since that time, it has been copied by hundreds of colleges in the United States, Canada, and Britain.

Ernest L. Boyer, president of the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, cited Gardner's program in his recent book "College: The Undergraduate Experience in America."

"I feel that John Gardner has touched the right issue at the right time," said Boyer in a recent interview. "Based on the work we did for 'College' it was very clear that the first days and weeks on campus are crucial and that many colleges were not taking advantage of the unusual opportunity they had to introduce students not just to social life, but to the academic life as well."

University 101 has previously been instrumental in helping freshmen survive their first year of college and improve their academic performance. Each year the course serves nearly half of the entering freshman class in 60 or more

sections on the Columbia campus alone. The national conference, originated in 1982, currently involves more than 1,500 educators in its East and West coast meetings.

In the workshop, participants will learn group building dynamics which work in both the classroom and the office, will discuss the needs of today's freshman, and will implement a plan to meet those needs.

Sessions on values clarification, advising and mentoring, teaching styles, and alternatives to the lecture method will be covered.

## Graduate Registration For Fall Semester Scheduled

Coastal graduate students may register for the fall semester August 22 through 25 from 3:30 to 4:45 p.m. in the registrar's office at the college.

USC graduate courses are offered at Coastal in the areas of education, librarianship, English, math, psychology, history, government, art education, journalism, social work, public health administration, and several other disciplines. USC also offers courses at Coastal leading to the professional MBA degree and the master of engineering degree.

Television instruction in some disciplines provides an alternative to traditional classroom instruction. TV instruction for these courses is offered on closed-circuit television, through ETV, or on tapes.

## "College After 25" Program Planned

Graduate and Continuing Education will hold "College After 25", a program designed to address concerns that adults encounter as they consider continuing their education, Tuesday, August 16, from 6 to 9 p.m. The program will be held in the Student Center, room 205.

Sessions, lead by Coastal faculty and staff who have expertise in working with adults, will cover topics such as: a broad overview of the Coastal campus and Georgetown extension; admission procedures; grants, scholarships, and

loans; effects of college on family; acceptance of younger students; and, evening and off-campus programs.
