

Graduate and Continuing Education Presents "Third Quarter"

"Third Quarter," a unique academic and cultural opportunity for individuals of retirement age on the Grand Strand, Waccamaw, and Georgetown areas, is now being offered at Coastal. The purpose of the program is to provide intellectual and cultural programming for adults age 55 and up in a college environment. A degree is not a prerequisite for participation.

Providing a new concept for learning, "Third Quarter" challenges instructors as well as participants to mix the academic subject matter with the life experiences of the adult student. Active, yet informal, class involvement is stressed with some out of class work being a part of the learning process, but no formal papers or exams will be required.

Library Center Shuttle Service **To Reduce Hours**

The Library Processing Center shuttle delivery service will reduce its schedule from five days a week to three. This change is anticipated to begin September 6, 1988, if a fulltime shuttle driver has been hired by that time. During the summer, students have driven the shuttle; however, with their return to school they will not be available after August 19, leaving the shuttle without a driver until a permanent driver can be hired. You may prefer to find an alternate method of delivery for materials during this time.

If the shuttle driver is unable to drive two of the three scheduled days, make-up runs will be made on Thursdays and/or Fridays. If the driver is absent three days, the shuttle will be cancelled for the remainder of the week. In the event of schedule changes such as these, the campus contact person will be notified as soon as possible. It is the responsibility of the campus contact person to notify all campus offices and personnel affected by the shuttle.

Because the shuttle service is operated primarily to deliver educational materials to and from campuses, the following items will be given priority:

- Interlibrary loan materials
- Educational films
- 3. Newly catalogued books
- Instructional Services materials and equipment
- Regular campus mail

Coastal To Hold Poetry Workshop

Coastal will offer a poetry writing workshop beginning the fall semester in Kimbel Library at the college. The course will begin August 29, and will meet Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 9 p.m. each week.

The workshop will offer interested beginning and advanced writers instruction in the craft of poetry as well as assistance in the preparation of manuscripts and identification of potential sources for publication.

Paul Rice, assistant professor of English at Coastal, will be the instructor of the workshop. Rice holds an MFA in creative writing and a Ph.D. in poetry and poetic theory. A widely published poet and reviewer of poetry, Rice's work has appeared most recently in the "Beloit Poetry Journal" and the "Georgia Review." His chapbook, "The Ossahatchee Codex" recently won the prestigious Atlanta Writing Center Chapbook Contest for 1988 and is scheduled for publication this fall.
