

o Dr. Andy Hendrick, associate professor of business administration, presented a paper, "Shoplifting and the South Carolina Merchant," at the annual meeting of the Southeastern Business Law Association in Orlando, Florida.

Hendrick also addressed the Conway Kiwanis Club on the topic of the municipal court's role in the criminal justice system. Dr. Hendrick is the muncipal judge for the City of Conway.

The project for both fall and spring semesters employs about twenty students to survey the 126 locations between Little River and Georgetown. The data generated from this

and similar studies throughout South Carolina is used to determine beach erosion rates and to establish the set back distances for new construction.

o Dr. Ballou Skinner, professor of physics, spoke to the fourth grade class of Waccamaw Elementary School, November 29. His topic was "The Space Shuttle and The Space Station." Dr. Skinner also gave the class the rules and requirements for entering the "Name the New Shuttle" contest. The class will take part in this contest.
