

### **Graduate And Continuing Education Teachers Sought**

Graduate and Continuing Education is looking for instructors to teach courses for Young People's College, Elderhostel and the fall 1989 Third Quarter.

Coastal will host Elderhostel, a program for senior citizens from all over the United States, on October 30 through November 3; November 6 through November 10; and December 11 through December 15. Teachers are being sought for six hours of academic instruction.

Instructors are also being sought for the fall 1989 session of Third Quarter, a cultural enrichment program for senior citizens. # **Coastal Carolina People**

o **Beth Haynes**, associate professor of economics, presented a paper entitled, "Prices and More Prices: Inflation and Other Cost of Economic Reform in the PRC," at the Southeastern Regional Conference of the Society of Asian Studies in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, on January 20 and 21. Haynes was invited to serve on the panel, "Modernization and Social Change in China," as a result of her participation in a Fulbright-Hayes Group Project last summer.

o Dr. Ballou Skinner, professor of physics, participated in a workshop, sponsored by the University of Miami, entitled "Enlightenment: The Best Security in a Nuclear-armed World," held at Key Biscayne, Florida. Many experts in nuclear issues, including Paul Warnke, former director of the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, and Alvin Weinberg, member of the Manhattan Project, spoke on the history, the technological advancement, the diplomacy, the strategic doctrines, and the moral and ethical questions of the Nuclear Armed World.

o Dr. Paul T. Gayes, assistant professor of marine science, recently traveled to the U.S. Geological Survey office in Woods Hole, Mass., to continue his ongoing research in conjunction with the U.S. Geological Survey and Connecticut Geological and Natural History Survey. Two Coastal marine science students accompanied Gayes to assist in the sediment sampling and were given tours of the U.S. Geological Survey, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, Connecticut Geological Survey, the Marine Sciences Research Center of the State University of New York, and the Queens College of the City University of New York facilities and graduate programs.
