

# Dame Receives College Of Charleston Alumni Award

Dr. Richard F. Dame, professor and chair of the Marine Science Department, has been named the 1989 Distinguished Alumnus of the Year at the College of Charleston. The award is presented annually to recognize alumni who have made significant contributions to their professions or to their communities over a period of time.

Dame graduated from the college in 1964 with a bachelor of science degree in biology. He received a master of arts degree in zoology from the University of North Carolina in 1967, and his Ph.D. degree in biology and marine science from the University of South Carolina in 1971.

Dame came to Coastal in 1971 as an assistant professor and became a full professor in 1979. The High School Guidance Counsel recognizes his Marine Science program at the college as one of the top three in the country.

During his tenure at Coastal, Dame initiated the undergraduate marine science major; implemented the first marine science correspondence course conducted through newspapers in the area; initiated the first television course in marine science in South Carolina; obtained more than \$5,000,000 for research grants in marine science through the University of South Carolina; and published a book entitled <u>Marsh Estuarine Systems Simulation</u>. Dame also has authored numerous scientific papers which have appeared in major science periodicals and has given more than 20 lectures at international scientific meetings.

Dame is an internationally recognized authority on the ecology of oyster reefs and mussel beds, and has traveled to the Netherlands and Jamaica to advise on projects in this field. He finished second in "The Cutting Edge," a competition conducted by the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education among the South Carolina state colleges to obtain research grants to support education of undergraduate students and develop the economic potential of South Carolina.

Among Dame's other accomplishments are being named one of the Outstanding Young Men in America in 1975 by the Junior Chamber of Commerce; listing in Marquis's Who's Who in the South and Southwest, Marquis's Who's Who in Emerging Science and Technology, and Bowker's American Men and Women of Science. He has served as marine science consultant to numerous agencies including the Smithsonian, the National Science Foundation and the U.S. Justice Department; and a consultant to several text book companies including W.C. Brown, West Publications and Prentiss-Hall.

Dame, his wife Meri, and daughters, Caroline and Elizabeth reside in North Litchfield.

An archaeology program at Coastal Carolina College will provide the basis for continued progress in exploring the physical history of our unique area.

# **Coastal Student Serves Internship At Walt Disney World**

Beth Brancato of Myrtle Beach, a senior marketing major at Coastal, was one of over 700 college students selected for an internship position during the spring 1989 semester at Walt Disney World in Lake Buena Vista, Florida. The internships are available to students as part of the Walt Disney World College Program.

Brancato gained hands-on working experience during her internship in marketing at the amusement park. She and student interns from the United States and eleven countries attended weekly seminars conducted by Disney's management team. Successful strategies and techniques in areas ranging from entertainment to maintenance and marketing to finance were discussed.

Interns also had the opportunity to exchange cultural and educational ideas by living in a specially designed student complex for one semester in central Florida.

In May, students participated in the celebration of the grand opening of the Disney-MGM Studios Theme Park. Segments of the festivities were broadcast as an NBC-TV special.

Brancato will graduate from Coastal in August, 1989.

# Junior Scholars Program In Theater Offered During Summer

Top academic students will have an opportunity to experience life in the theater during the Junior Scholars Program in Theater at Coastal, Sunday, July 23 to Sunday, July 30.

The program is open to any South Carolina public school student who has been identified as a Junior Scholar based on his or her performance on the PSAT, a prelude test to the SAT.

The program will involve students working in small groups, receiving ten hours of instruction in acting skills, costume design, and set/technical design. Each evening, students will rehearse for a full-scale production which will be presented the final day of the program.

Director of acting for the program is Jay Thompson, known throughout the United States for his theatrical work and coauthor of *Once Upon a Mattress*. Locally, Thompson has directed shows in many cities in South Carolina and his original plays have been featured at Piccolo Spoleto in Charleston.

Technical director for the program is Jeff Nichols, whose work in theater extends from Maine to South Carolina. Nichols was visiting professor of theater and speech at Coastal this past year and has been technical director of numerous professional, college and community productions.

Donna Catton-Johnson, who has costumed over 25 productions, will be costume director.

Students will learn theatrical skills in Wheelwright Auditorium and will benefit from Coastal's complete technical and costume shops and professional stage.

Students will stay in air-conditioned residence halls and all meals will be served in the Student Center cafeteria. Coastal's Physical Education Center swimming and recreational facilities also will be available to the students.

Fee for the program is \$400 and includes meals, residence hall fees, costuming and technical materials, instructional fees, and a Junior Scholars T-shirt. A \$50 deposit is required at time of registration. Financial need scholarship information is also available.

Application deadline is Tuesday, June 6.
