### **Spring Arts Festival**

USC Coastal Carolina College will hold its twelfth annual Spring Arts Festival, Wednesday, April 4 through Saturday, April 7. Artists from the Coastal Carolina College faculty, along with colleagues from throughout the region will participate in the four-day event, celebrating music, dance, theater, and literature through presentations, concerts and seminars.

### Oakland Ballet To Perform At Coastal

The Oakland Ballet, one of the West's major professional ballet companies, will perform at Coastal, Thursday, April 5 at 8 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium.

Oakland Ballet was founded in 1965 by Ronn Guidi. During the past two decades, the company has earned an outstanding reputation for the preservation of ballet masterworks from the Diaghilev and early 20th century repertoires and the presentation of innovative contemporary choreography.

Pursuing an artistic course emphasizing what is unique, innovative and historically significant, The Oakland Ballet has set standards of excellence and daring which rival larger companies. The Oakland Ballet is recognized nationwide for its diverse repertoire, ranging from 20th century masterpieces to works by contemporary choreographers. In response to the demands of this varied repertoire, Oakland Ballet dancers display a distinctive style that is freshly classical, reflecting energy, enthusiasm and a dramatic flair.

Oakland Ballet Artistic Director Ronn Guidi, who believes teaching is as great an art as dancing, studied ballet for ten years under the late Raoul Pause, director of the Ballet

Players Guild of Oakland. From 1958-61, Guidi lived in Italy, Germany and Denmark, expanding his knowledge of classical dance. Upon his return to the United States, he taught for three years as associate supervisor of ballet at the University of California, Berkeley and was principal dancer with Pause's company. Guidi started choreographing ballets for Pause, and was named associate director of the company (renamed Oakland Civic Ballet) in 1961. In 1965,

Guidi founded the Oakland Ballet and three years later opened the Oakland Ballet Academy, which serves as the primary training ground for future Oakland Ballet dancers.

The festival will feature the films Jean de Florette and Manon of the Springs, both directed by Claude Beri.

Jean de Florette will be presented at 2:30 p.m. The film tells the story of a hunchback tax collector who leaves the city with his wife and child for a farm he inherited. The farm and its spring are coveted by his neighbor, Soubreyan and Soubreyan's nephew, who block up the stream and wait for Jean to fail.

Manon of the Springs will be presented at 7:30 p.m. The film is a companion film to Jean and takes up the story ten years later, when Jean's daughter returns to the village. Seeking revenge for her father's death, she stops up the village's water supply and acts as the catalyst for the fall of Soubreyan and his nephew.

Those who attend the film festival, are invited to bring a picnic to enjoy in Spadoni Park between showings of the films.
