Registration For Summer I Session

Undergraduate registration for the Summer I session will be held Wednesday, June 6 and Thursday, June 7, from 9 to 11 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m. in the registrar's office. The Summer I session begins Monday, June 11 and ends Friday, July 6.

Graduate registration will be held the same days from 3 to 5 p.m.

Summer I is the first of two summer sessions offered at Coastal. The Summer II session runs from Monday, July 9 to Thursday, August 9.

New students should apply to the college through the office of admission prior to registration.

Rice Receives National Endowment for Humanities Summer Stipend

Dr. Paul Rice, assistant professor of English, has received a 1990 National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) summer stipend.

Rice has received the \$3,500 grant for summer research work that involves the study of 19th century American Indian poetry -- specifically the work of Creek Indian poet Alex Posey and Cherokee Indian poet John Rollin Ridge.

This summer, Rice will work on the project at Princeton University. He will travel to Tulsa, Oklahoma at the Gilcrease Institute at a later date to continue his research.

Rice says he hopes the result of the research will be the publishing of several new editions of 19th century American Indian poetry.

Rice has been a Coastal faculty member for three years. He previously taught English at Brunswick College, Brunswick, Georgia. He received a master of fine arts degree in creative writing from the University of Arkansas, and his Ph.D. in poetry and poetics from Catholic University, Washington, D.C.

NEH summer stipends require the completion of a specific piece of work -- an identifiable, discrete section of a larger work or a smaller project that can be completed during the summer. Each college or university can submit three nominations chosen by a campus committee from all applicants, and those three proposals are submitted to the NEH for final selection.

Coastal Student To Study Abroad

Michael Brady of Myrtle Beach, a history major at Coastal, will spend his junior year studying abroad at Warwick University in England through a fellowship he has been awarded by Coastal.

Brady, who plans a career in radio broadcasting, says he learned about the opportunity from Dr. Fred Hicks, professor of history. As part of the selection process, Brady had to submit a 1,500-word essay, and undergo an interview by a committee from the USC Columbia History Department.

Brady, who will leave for England in September, says he is thrilled about the upcoming year.

"I wanted to do this not only for the educational value, but because it's something new and different for me to explore," he said. "This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity."
