Joyner hosts ETV series

Charles Joyner will be the oncamera host of "Legacy of Conflict," a four-part series on South Carolina and the Civil War which will air on the South Carolina Educational Television Network at 10:30 p.m. September 24 - 27.

The series was filmed on location throughout the state. Several sequences were filmed in Conway, Little River, Wachesaw, Hobcaw, and other locations in the Wacammaw Region.

It features interviews with local historians Rod Gragg and Burgin Berry as well as segments with nationally and internationally-recognized scholars of the Civil War era.

Larson has completed 27 panels for nine mural projects in three states. His most recent murals can be seen in the New

Municipal Building in Jefferson City, Mo. and in the Guitar Building Lobby in Columbia, Mo. The Colorado-native has been a professor of art at Columbia College in Columbia, Mo. since 1951. He is also the curator for the State Historical Society of Missouri. Larson has written numerous reviews and other critical matter on art and design.
