Wheelwright Passport Series announced discounts available to faculty, staff, students

USC Coastal Carolina College has announced the Wheelwright Passport series for the 1990-1991 season. The Wheelwright Passport is a series of 15 plays, musicals, theater performances, cultural arts programs and films.

Faculty and staff may purchase Wheelwright Passports for \$45 (50 percent off the normal price of \$90). This season ticket admits the holder to all events including the Wheelwright Series, the Cultural Arts Series, Coastal Theater, and the Film Series.

The Wheelwright Series will open with the internationally-renowned *Tchaikovsky Chamber Orchestra* on Thursday, Oct. 25. Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet* will round out the schedule for the Wheelwright series with a January 28th performance by the John Houseman Group I Acting Company.

The Cultural Arts Series consists of three performances including an afternoon concert of Cajun music by the widely-acclaimed band, *Beausoleil*, on Sunday, Oct. 7; a Tuesday, March 12 performance of the John Maxwell one-man show, *Oh, Mr. Faulkner, Do You Write?*; and the Sunday, April 7 performance by the Swiss dance, mime, magic and puppetry troupe, *Mummenschanz Mask and Mime Company*.

The Theater Series includes modern comedy and mystery produced by the dramatic arts department. The first performance is the Frank Dunlop and Jim Dale slapstick comedy, *Scapino*, Friday, Oct. 12 through Sunday, Oct. 14. *And Miss Reardon Drinks a Little* follows Friday, Nov. 16, through Sunday, Nov. 18. This Paul Zindel comedy is about three grown sisters and the intrigues of the American education system. Friday, March 1, through Sunday, March 3, Agatha Christie's long-running mystery, *The Mousetrap*, will be presented in celebration of the playwright's 100th birthday.

The Theater Series ends with the Friday, April 19, through Sunday, April 21 performance of Tennessee Williams' brilliant play about the fantasies and dreams which make happiness possible, *The Glass Menagerie*.

Six award-winning international films are showcased the Film Series. They are: *Walkabout*, Sunday, Sept. 30; *Loves of a Blonde*, Sunday, Nov. 4; *84 Charing Cross Road*, Sunday, Jan. 20; *The Cranes are Flying*, Sunday, Feb. 17; *Babette's Feast*, Sunday, March 17; *The Little Thief*, Sunday, March 31.
