Center for Marine and Wetland Studies to host public forum on dredging

Coastal is hosting a public forum on dredging Thursday,
October 11, from 7 to 8:30 p.m. at the Myrtle Beach Martinique Hotel,
7100 North Ocean Boulevard. The forum, *Dredging Issues: Port of Georgetown*, is open to the public at no charge.

As the second in Coastal's Center for Marine and Wetland Studies four-part series on Environmental Issues, the public forum on dredging will feature professionals who serve as panelists. Included are Earl Hayter of Clemson University, Don Herndon of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Steve Gilbert of the U.S. Department of Fish and Wildlife, and William Oberst of the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce.

The forum will be moderated by Paul Gayes, director of Coastal's Center for Marine and Wetland Studies.

Other public forums in the series are Coastal Pollution: Risk Assessment in Setting Environmental Pollution Standards on Thursday, Oct. 25, and Wetland Issues: Environmental Assessment, Regulatory Policies, and Implications for Future Economic Development on Thursday, November 8.

Coastal Theater presents Scapino

Scapino, a Jim Dale and Frank Dunlop comedy, will be presented as part of the Wheelwright Passport Coastal Theater series Friday, October 12, and Saturday, October 3 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, October 14 at 3 p.m.

Scapino is loosely based on a Moliere play, Les Fourberies de Scapin. Critics have called Scapino comedy madness.

Scapino director and costume designer Charles Whetzel said, "The play was a financial and critical hit on Broadway in the 1970s because it was a perfect evening of fun for the entire family. The New York Times said at the time, 'If you miss it, you will be crazy, and if your kids miss it, you will be simply inhuman."

The production is designed by Ken Parks. A recent graduate of the University of Mississippi with a master's degree in fine arts, Parks is the newly appointed professor of design and technical theater. Parks comes to Horry County after a successful season with the Oklahoma Shakespeare Festival.

The cast of *Scapino* includes many faces familiar to Coastal Carolina College Theater as well as some new ones. Sean Pierce, Michael Matthews, Lou Nordeen and Ted Detwiler recently performed in *South Pacific*. Kitty Gundling, David Russell and Sol Steinberg appeared in *The Tempest*. New to the Coastal stage are Lynn Mulhern, Debbie Rahn, Robin McPherson, Rorie Litos and Matt Morris.

Jacqueline L. Gmuca recently had a character analysis of Cathleen ni Houlihan published in Magill's Cyclopedia of Literary Characters II. Gmuca also lectured at the national conference, Responsibilities for Literacy, on the topic "School-College Collaboration for Appropriate Assessment of Literacy." This presentation was based on her work with Beck Middle School in Georgetown as a higher education representative for Project REACH, the South Carolina Rural Education Alliance for Collaborative Humanities.




