Professor offers stress counsel

Paul Stanton is doing his part to ease the tensions brought on by the deployment of area soldiers to the Middle East. Stanton has conducted a stress workshop at the Myrtle Beach Air Force Base for the families of those who have been called to active military duty.

Co-sponsored by Graduate and Continuing Education and the Myrtle Beach Air Force Base Morale, Welfare and Recreation Office, the workshop provided a 90-minute overview of stress, including the common perceptions and misconceptions of stress, and how to best deal with stress. The workshop attracted 17 participants.

Stanton said "stress is often perceived as a challenge or a threat." But the best way to deal with stress is to be aware of its presence; only then can stress be dealt with functionally, he said.

"I've also given those who are interested access to me on an individual basis for counselling — and have gotten a pretty good response," Stanton said. "I would like to do what I can for the guys," he said. ∞
