Cheerleader heads to Middle East

Like thousands of other military men and women, Coastal student John Mann has been called to active duty.

The marine science major reported to duty Friday, Nov. 30 and then left for Fort Stewart near Savannah, Ga. for 21 days of training to be followed by five weeks of desert training in California. Mann is a member of the HHC 1st Battalion 263rd Armor of Mullins.

Prior to joining the National Guard in September, Mann was in the U.S. Army. In January 1988, Mann began a 22-month stint in Panama. He joined the Army Airborne Infantry in 1987, stationed in Fort Benning, Ga. Mann is from Rochester, N.Y. At Coastal, he is a varsity cheerleader, a member of the Spirit Club and a Kappa Tau Omega pledge.

The cheerleading squad and coach Kim Grant honored Mann with a plaque during halftime of the Thursday, Nov. 29 basketball game. According to Grant, the cheerleaders will wear yellow ribbons through the basketball season as long as servicemen, like Mann, are on active duty.

Linda Carmichael, supervisor of records in the Office of the Registrar, said approximately five Coastal students have withdrawn from classes this month due to the Persian

Gulf situation.
