A Message from the Chancellor

After talking with numerous faculty and reviewing the questions received by the Long Range Planning Committee, I find that there are some basic documents pertinent to the relationship of Coastal Carolina to the USC System that should be helpful for an informed discussion.

These useful documents are the July 1990 Ad Hoc Committee Report with historical data and the USC contract; legislation regarding governance at Francis Marion College, College of Charleston, and Lander College; and a listing of property ownership at Coastal Carolina College.

These materials will supplement the materials already available at the circulation desk in Kimbel Library. The questions submitted to the Long Range Planning Committee are being addressed by the appropriate academic and administrative officers, and responses will be given to the committee during October.

Italian film featured in first of seven-part international film series

The Italian film *Cinema Paradiso* will be presented Sunday, September 15 at 3 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium as the first in the seven-part international film segment of the 1991-1992 Wheelwright Passport. Tickets for *Cinema Paradiso* are \$3, or \$2 for students.

The recollections of a successful Italian film director, *Cinema Paradiso* traces his childhood in a Sicilian village in the 1940s and 1950s. As an altar boy, Salvatore found the movies and life at the makeshift cinema more alluring than his duties at the church. Taken under the wing of the projectionist, the boy comes of age at a time when traditional life in the village is giving way to a new, popular culture. *Cinema Paradiso* is a poignant, nostalgic view of Sicilian culture meeting the 20th century.

Other films included in the international series are: *High Hopes*; *Ginger and Fred*; *Mama, There's a Man in Your Bed*; *A Taxing Woman*; *Patner Panchali*; and *Pandora's Box*.

The Wheelwright Passport, a ticket to 18 cultural events including The Minnesota Opera presentation of Mozart's *The Magic Flute*, jazz-pop singer Susannah McCorkle, USC Chamber Orchestra, professional and college theater, and more, can be purchased for \$89. Faculty and staff may purchase two Passports for \$89. Special student pricing information is available at the box office.

Powell to perform piano concert

Since joining the Coastal faculty in 1988, Powell has performed as a soloist with the Long Bay Symphony, has appeared with the Charleston Symphony and the USC Orchestra, and has been featured on South Carolina Public Radio. With funding from the Horry County Arts Council,

he competed in the 46th Annual Music Competition in Geneva, Switzerland in 1990. He also has appeared in the Young Artist Series of the Aspen Summer Music Festival in Aspen, Colo.

Powell received his master's degree in music from Indiana University in 1988. He has recently returned from working on his doctorate in piano performance at Indiana University in Bloomington, Ind.

Linda Hollandsworth received an academic specialist grant from the U.S. Information Agency to teach in the Summer School of English at Adam Michiewicz in Poznan, Poland, from July 25 to August 19.

Susan Libes attended the 20th Gordon Conference on Chemical Oceanography held at the Kimball Union Academy in Meriden, NH, August 12 to 16. She presented a poster entitled: "Oyster Reefs and Nutrient Retention in Estuarine Ecosystems" which summarized research done in collaboration with Richard Dame.
