A Message from the Chancellor...

I have been approached recently by a few faculty members regarding memos that have been circulating among the faculty concerning raises in this fiscal year. From what I have been able to determine, there is a lot of confusion and misinformation. I believe that some of the confusion is a result of comparing current salaries with salary data for 1989 - 1990. Because merit increases were given in 1990-1991, almost every faculty and staff member has received a salary increase since 1989-1990.

For 1991-1992, there were only eleven salary increases among unclassified employees. Nine of those were to faculty who had received rank promotions and two were to individuals on annual contracts. No administrator received a salary increase for the current year. Classified staff have not been eligible for merit increases since July 1, 1991, but are eligible for salary adjustments if the S. C. Division of Human Resource Management determines that there have been significant changes in job duties. There have been very few of those this

Advertising exchange trip to Europe set

An exchange trip to Eastern Europe for advertising professionals is planned for July 28 to Aug 7. Participants will visit advertising agencies, electronic and print producers and entrepreneurs in Prague, Budapest and Munich and includes opportunities for sightseeing.

Professor completes manuscript to be published in Spanish and English

James Henderson has completed the manuscript for a textbook, Colombia in the Times of Laureano Gomez, 1889-1965; Volume I, Toward Modernity, 1889-1932. The first volume will be published in Spanish and English language editions and will be Henderson's seventh published book. He has started work on a second volume.

Henderson earned his Ph.D. in Latin American History from Texas Christian University in 1972. He has been a faculty member since 1986.

In addition to books, Henderson has had numerous articles published, and has spoken at many international and national conferences. He was awarded a Fulbright Travel Stipend to present a paper at a conference in Ibagué, Colombia in August 1991 and received a Coastal Faculty Research Grant. Henderson has also been the recipient of five Tulane University Mellon Grants used for library and curriculum development in Kimbel Library.
