Chairman Larry Lyles brought the meeting to order at 3:33 p.m.

President David DeCenzo reported that next year's budget presentation was made to the House of Representatives a few weeks ago. He asked for more positions to hire faculty to accommodate the University's growth. The presentation was only half as long as last year but received well. The Senate presentation will be sometime in March.

Provost and Executive Vice President Ralph Byington reported for Dean Michael Roberts that a \$350,000 NSF grant has been applied for to purchase a 400 MHz Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Spectrometer (NMR) to be used in biochemistry and chemistry.

In order for Coastal Carolina to better serve the Georgetown area, a Fifth T Innovation Group been established. The intent is for local entrepreneurs who are creating new business ventures to receive support from the Innovation Center. It is uncertain when the office will be opened because of the recent flooding.

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As there was no further business, Marion Lee moved to adjourn and Sam Frink seconded.
