Chairman Natasha Hanna brought the Government Affairs Committee to order at 4:00 p.m.

Will Turner moved to approve the May 4, 2018 Government Affairs Committee minutes. Gene Spivey seconded, and the motion passed.

President David DeCenzo was pleased with the breakfast held earlier this morning with the local delegation and Board of Trustees. During the meeting the legislators were informed regarding a comparison of increases in tuition and required fees for FY 2018-19 for the 12 universities in the state for full-time and in-state undergraduate students which showed Coastal Carolina is ranked number eight. For out-of-state students, the University is ranked number six. The average undergraduate in-state rate is \$12,222 and CCU is \$11,336—below average. Appreciation was

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expressed to the delegation for the increased state funding which increased 6.77% for next year. Although the recurring state funding for next year is \$13.688M, the University continues to lag behind every other university in the state. Also shared with the delegation that the University came out of last year's budget in better shape than ever.

Hanna felt the breakfast went very well and would like to continue meeting with the delegation twice a year.

As there was no further business, Samuel Swad moved to adjourn, and Wyatt Henderson seconded. The meeting adjourned.
